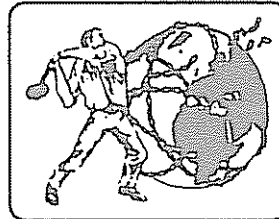

August 1985

Support the armed struggle against racism and imperialism in South Africa!

- Making peace without weapons in South Africa?
- Without the leadership of the proletariat and its Marxist-Leninist party the revolution cannot be insured and carried out
- The bloody trace of German imperialism in Southern Africa
- Also today: the string of the bloody colonial history of the German imperialism towards Africa is not cut off
- Protection of the “German interests” in today’s South Africa and Namibia – guaranteed by German money and German weapons
- The double tactic of West German imperialism
- Instead of phrases and appeals to the executioners: weapons for the black liberation fighters!

June 1986

Cold-blooded murder of over 400 men and women fighters, above all from the C. P. of Peru, amidst applause from the “Socialist International” in Lima
The fascist deeds of social-democracy in Peru

In addition: Our main criticism of the C. P. of Peru

September 1986

Prevent the deportation and mass expulsion of political persecutees who demand the right of asylum! Combat the stultification and baiting of the Westgerman population!

Westgerman Imperialism foments the atmosphere of pogroms

- The hypocrisy of social democracy
- One of the essential causes for political persecution in the world:
The crimes of Westgerman imperialism
- Solidarity!

In addition: What is a political persecutee? – For the matter of profit, Westgerman imperialism goes over dead bodies: some facts of late – Right of asylum for everybody?

October 1990

October 3, 1990: Is the annexation of the GDR and West Berlin complete?

The last word has not yet been spoken!

- The swallowing whole of the GDR and West Berlin is not yet “digested”.
- West German imperialism is a giant with feet of clay!
- Declare war on West German imperialism!

June 1991

50 years ago, German imperialism attacked the then-socialist Soviet Union:

No illusions about West/German imperialism!

- The West/German imperialists and the Gorbachev revisionists cannot erase the memory of the Soviet Union’s just war for the defense of socialism and for the liberation of the peoples!
 - The victory over Nazi fascism is inseparably tied to the name of Stalin!
 - Ever-stronger West/German imperialism – an aggressive imperialist great power and a source of wars in its own right!
 - Vigilance and irreconcilable struggle!

September 1991/September 1993 in English

In the long run the workers of the Soviet Union will bring to an end this anti-communist and revisionist nightmare, with another proletarian revolution!

Neither Gorbachov, nor Yeltsin, not the “Brezhnevists” will lead the Soviet Union out of decay and crisis!

- For a long time the Soviet Union has not been a bulwark of the world revolution any more!
- The advance of the western, especially the West/German imperialists
- Modern revisionists are decisively responsible for the present situation! Their role must not be played down!
- Imperialism is a giant with feet of clay

October 1991/June 1995 in English

Nazis are doing the dirty work for CDU/SPD/FDP/GREENS who have long proclaimed a policy of "deterrence":

Pogroms!

- Police on the side of the Nazis!
- Fight state terror and Neo-Nazi terror!
- The dirty phrase of "Understanding for the population"
- Argue where possible, strike where necessary
- Our tasks

In addition: Fight the Nazis in the spirit of Stalin's toughness!

January 1992

A Nazi criminal and his career: Nazi officer – Official of the revisionist SED (Socialist Unity Party of Germany) – Top-Level Social Democrat Politician

What the “Just Case” shows us

- SPD and CDU – their “indignation” about untried Nazi criminals is pure hypocrisy
- The “Just Case” – a ploy to divert attention from the rehabilitated Nazi criminals in West Germany
- Fight for the punishment of Nazi criminals
- Basic revolutionary tasks

The January leaflet of "Gegen die Strömung" carried the title:

On the Co-operation of the Revolutionary Forces of German Nationalities in Germany

"During the last months the new government of the social democracy and the Green (SPD-Grüne) has announced the possibility of ending off the economy and of dropping the national state of the German Democratic Republic (DDR) as a 'democratic' step. It is important that the 'German book is just', that investigation has to be conducted 'to the end' and to be continued and strengthened (thinking off and dropping lines as well as the dispersion measures of the proletarian forces in the Nazi occupied territories against the German government's system of 'double strategy' of 'peaceful' and 'revolutionary' government building & to direct from 41 own actual revolutionary parties in the spirit of German nationalism. The 29th of the CPSU and the German left party (the 'left' and 'right') have not been about 29th. This is means they do not get stuck in a decision of political details, and instead of this to develop a principled Communist point of view concerning the revolutionary perspective and the revolutionary co-operation of the workers of German nationalism in Germany. This is possible only on the basis of the program of the also existing progressive aspects of the modern migration of national, particularly in the struggle against all varieties of the imperialist bourgeoisie politics conducted by the two proletarian revolutionary organizations towards the workers from other countries"

After this, the following main points and aspects are subjected to a closer view:
